Huge thanks to everyone who joined and who helped clean up for our eclipse party last Monday!

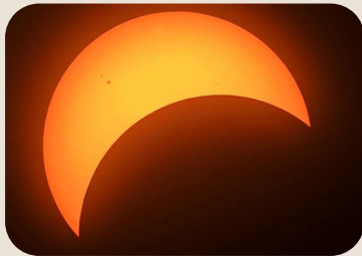

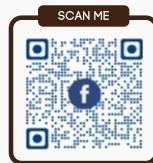


## Prayer Requests
